p. 92, No. 36: (8+12) pieces; in *Albrecht* with bBb8 (missing in *WinChloe* ID 759 054).

p. 94, No. 37: for the purported original see <https://pdb.dieschwalbe.de/P1255018> (559v. *Die Schwalbe* 4/1932), but I couldn't find the problem in that *Schwalbe* issue.

p. 98, No. 50: Commendation (according to *WinChloe*).

p. 102, No. 61: *Albrecht* #291.429 gives a corrected version (+ bNf8), just as *WinChloe* ID 886 328.

No. 66: Commendation (according to *WinChloe*).

p. 106, No. 74 is a slightly corrected version in accordance with <https://www.yacpdb.org/#39688>; cp. *Albrecht* #293.748.

p. 108, there is a version of problem No. 77, i.e. <https://pdb.dieschwalbe.de/P1324364> (127v *Szachista* 12/1933) not included in the book.

p. 114, No. 98 (corr., cp. *PDB* P1253405); other corrections by Miguel Uris (*Albrecht* #240.492) and by Luis Gomez (*Albrecht* #240.493).

p. 120, No. 111: Stipulation (2#) and pieces (8+12) are missing.

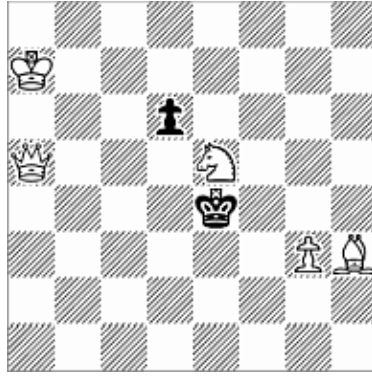
p. 124, problem No. 128: **source misprinted**; correct is *Problemas*, March–April 1953.

p. 132, No. 142: Dedicated to D. Przepiórka

p. 134, No. 144: (6+7) pieces

No. 145: (7+5) pieces

No. 147: **diagram misprinted**; the correct position with (5+2) pieces is:

White – in the *Schwalbe* magazine; see 972. *Die Schwalbe*, April 1930 (PDB: P1219062).
